The Paschal Triduum of the passion and resurrection of Christ is the culmination of the entire liturgical year. It begins with the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, and reaches its high point in the Easter Vigil, and closes with evening prayer on Easter Sunday. The triduum is a single prayer of final preparation where we enter into the redemption of humanity and the salvation of the world made present in the Resurrection of our Lord.
